#### **MEMBERS' BENEFITS**

We have been working hard on getting benefits for members. So far we have achieved the following. Some of our members already have these benefits under other relationships with the ANU; others have not until now.

- 1. Library borrowing rights for \$50 per annum which is far cheaper than what it costs ordinary members of Convocation.
- 2. The right to buy packs of one day parking scratchies which entitle you to park anywhere at ANU for \$2 a day. Also, the right to apply for free parking for special events such as Conferring of Degrees Ceremonies and other high days. Ordinary members of the public are not entitled to these benefits. They have to park in designated areas and feed the metres.
