PARKING

The Vice-Chancellor has agreed that people who are working in an Honorary capacity for more than 20 hours a week on campus can apply for a Parking Permit at the student rate of \$138.60. Written confirmation from the university area concerned will be required.

Members working for less than those hours can apply for parking scratchies as described below in 'Members Benefits'.

MEMBERS' BENEFITS

The benefits shown overleaf are available to current ANUEF Card Holders. Some new members may not yet have a card. They should contact Nik Fominas on

nik.fominas@technik.com.au or ring 0411 186 199. Production of 2004 cards for the bulk of members will happen early next year

1. **Library borrowing rights** for \$50 per annum which is far cheaper than what it costs ordinary members of Convocation.
2. The right to buy packs of one-day parking scratchies which entitle you to park all day in **Permit Parking** spots at ANU for \$2 a day. Also, the right to apply for free parking for special events such as Conferring of Degrees Ceremonies and other high days. Ordinary members of the public are not entitled to these benefits. They have to park in designated areas and feed the meters.
3. The right to be posted **ANU Reporter** if you wish.
4. A place in the pages of the **ANU Annual Report**.
5. An ability to get staff discounts from **PCTech**.

The right to use **University House Library** facilities.

The right to apply for membership of one of the **ANU National Institutes**.

8. \$2 tickets to concerts given by the **Canberra School of Music**. This does not apply to concerts provided by outside organisations in Llewellyn Hall.

If there are any other benefits that you would like us to pursue, please let us know.
